Thank you for your request made under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), transferred to Inland Revenue from the office of the Minister of Revenue, Hon Simon Watts, on 11 April 2025. You requested the following:

Copies of any reports, briefings, letters, aide memoire, cabinet papers, notes, advice and emails related to:

- a) The total spend within your portfolio, specific to our region (Ngāti Rangi);
- b) The spend referred to in (a) broken down by services, programmes and providers including iwi and Māori organisations;
- c) Any other expenditure or activities associated with Ngāti Rangi since 10 March 2018; broken down by date and personnel.

Inland Revenue captures expenditure through cost centres, which can be refined to a specific segment or function within Inland Revenue. However, as these cost centres do not have a geographic indicator, we are unable to determine expenditure by region.

Inland Revenue also does not collate ethnicity information, nor the level of detail required to identify all customers within an iwi or hapū.

As such, your request for any reports, briefings, letters, aide memoires, Cabinet papers, notes, advice, or emails related to the total spend within the Ngāti Rangi region, a breakdown of this spend, and any other expenditure or activities associated with Ngāti Rangi since 10 March 2018 is refused under section 18(e), as the documents alleged to contain the information requested do not exist.

Right of review
