Thank you for your request made under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), received on 17 December 2024. You requested the following:

"please provide a breakdown of: - income/revenue by industry at ANZSIC level 4 for the last 5 years - percentage of taxpayers that do not have industry data"

On 19 December 2024, Inland Revenue attempted to clarify the scope of your request; to date, Inland Revenue has not received a response.

I have therefore interpreted your request for the percentage of all taxpayers that do not have industry data to relate to taxpayers that are in business and not all possible taxpayers (e.g. salary and wage earners) recorded in Inland Revenue's system.

Information publicly available

A breakdown of income/revenue by industry at ANZSIC level 4 is publicly available on Statistics New Zealand's website (stats.govt.nz) by searching for "Annual enterprise survey" and the relevant financial year. Consequently, I have decided to refuse this part of your request under section 18(d) of the OIA, as the information is publicly available.

Information being released

For the percentage of taxpayers calculation, I have included in scope to be the following:

- Trusts or estates reporting non-zero trading income
- Individuals reporting non-zero self-employment income
- Partnerships or companies with non-zero¹ total income.

There are 507,873 taxpayers within scope of this question for the 2022-23 tax year. Of these, 6.9% do not have an industry classification.

¹ Excluding taxpayers with nil income
